



SF Day has been in frequent, ongoing communication with the entire parent community and the formal Parents Association. In advance of submitting this application, Back to School Nights that featured extensive Q&A about COVID-19 and reopening plans were held. In addition, a survey is being sent to all families on Sept. 23. The questions and results will be available during the site visit.

Meetings and discussions with staff are also frequent and ongoing. When the School issued its initial plan in July, division heads conducted multiple grade-level faculty meetings. Head of School Mike Walker held six small group sessions with faculty and staff the week of August 17. Here is the list of attendees and questions they submitted ahead of time. Dean of Faculty Loren Moye held two open feedback sessions around reopening and COVID for any interested faculty & staff on Thursday, Sep 3, and Friday, Sep 4. Health and Safety Plan preparation was discussed and feedback gathered in full faculty meetings on Aug. 31, Sept. 14, and Sept. 21. In addition, a survey is being sent to all faculty on Sept. 23. The questions and results will be available during the site visit.

Risk Acknowledgement Form: The <u>Risk Acknowledgement Form</u> will be sent to each SF Day family, who must sign the form electronically in advance of their student(s) returning to campus.

Cleaning and Disinfection: To ensure a clean and sanitary campus environment for students and staff, the School is following the <u>CDC cleaning and disinfection guidelines</u>. The full cleaning and disinfection protocol is available in the <u>SF Day Health and Safety Plan</u>.

Cohorting: To minimize the number of individuals students and instructional faculty come into contact with while on campus, the School has created small, stable cohorts with fixed membership that stay together for all on-campus activities (e.g., instruction, lunch, recess). Cohorts will avoid contact with other groups or individuals who are not part of the cohort. The full details are available in the <u>SF Day Health and Safety Plan</u>.

Outdoor instruction: Outdoor activities, both on and off campus, will be encouraged to the extent possible as weather conditions permit. Full details are available in the <u>SF Day Health</u> and <u>Safety Plan</u>.

Entrance, Egress, and Movement Within the School: To ensure safe entrance, egress, and movement within the school, the School has reconfigured the campus and implemented a number of measures that will mitigate risk and promote safety precautions. Full details are available in the *SF Day Health and Safety Plan*.

Face Coverings and Other Essential Protective Gear: To mitigate the risk of exposure to COVID-19 on campus, all students and staff will be required to wear face coverings.
